## MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

Welcome to the summer edition of The Voice newsletter. It's been a very busy 2017 so far and I'm continuing to meet so many of you as I travel around the country. As you know the Board and the Senior Management Team are working on our new organisational strategy 2017 – 2020, so we've been engaged in a comprehensive consultation process to inform the strategy. Consultation sessions have taken place with staff, branches, carers, volunteers, people living with dementia, the national dementia office and corporate partners and I appreciate everyone's role in helping to form our new vision.

Last year I presented Minister for Older People Helen McEntee with the 25,000 signatures collected as part of the ASI campaign 'Dementia Care Begins at Home', so we welcomed the news that the Minister will begin a consultation process that will lead to the development of a statutory home care scheme, which will be a crucial step in ensuring that people with dementia will have more choice in the care they can access. In other policy work we will be launching our Pre-Budget Submission 2018 and continue to advocate for dementia specific funding.

I was happy to see ASI services are continuing to grow steadily within the community. Day care is up 3% on 2016 delivering 137,485 hours in the first three months of 2017, our helpline service had 1,340 service users availing of this six day service in the first quarter of 2017 a 14% increase on 2016 and our Dementia Advisers are showing strong growth with 420 new clients availing of this post diagnosis service which is a 15% increase on 2016. These growth figures are very impressive so well done to everyone involved.

The All-Party Oireachtas Group is going from strength to strength and this year has seen them host a round-table event for key stakeholders to advance the discussion on how Ireland can develop a scheme for home care and a second session on 'Building Dementia Awareness in the Oireachtas'.

There is trojan work being carried out by the Irish Dementia Working Group and the Dementia Carers Campaign Network. I'm delighted to report the Irish Dementia Working Group elected their first steering group, congratulations to Des O'Grady, Kathy Ryan, Dolores Power, Roan Smith, Anne McGeown and Helen Rochford Brennan, on their election. And the Dementia Carers Campaign Network launched their dedicated twitter account @DCCNIRL so please do

follow them, it's great to see how everyone one is getting on.

We had such a positive response to our Tea Day campaign this year, proudly supported for the second year running by Medtronic. You came out in your droves to support your local services by getting the kettle on and the pictures and monies you all raised are still being collected. We had a great morning with TV3's Ireland AM at our Heskin Court day centre, thanks to all the staff there who looked after us so well. Also a big thank you to everyone who took part in the programme and who shared their personal experiences of the ASI.

A special thank you to ASI Ambassador Miss Ireland Niamh Kennedy and her Mam Catherine, who shared their story of dementia with all the nation to help raise awareness and to Ronan Smith from the Irish Dementia Working Group who welcomed TV3 into his home to give people a snap shot of what it's like living with early onset familial Alzheimer's. Congratulations to everyone who managed to get themselves a one-off tea cosy knit by the TV3 viewers, they alone rose close to €2,000.

Carers week is always an important week in my calendar and this year we marked it with the launch of our De-Stress Research Report which was led by Trinity College Dublin's NEIL programme. This report examines the health and wellbeing of spousal carers of people with dementia. Thank you to all the carers who gave their time, which is very precious when you are looking after a loved one, to be part of this essential report.

Have you spotted the Mobile Information Bus in your locale yet? Since its launch late last year it's been doling out advice and support for people in Waterford, Cork, Kerry and Dublin and plans to continue its journey throughout the country. The bus was made possible by the very generous donation from The Peggy Mangan Foundation and to them we are extremely grateful as the bus allows us to help increase awareness about dementia all across the country. If you see them please stop by and say hi.

I hope you all have wonderful summer and I look forward to meeting you all on my travels.

# ASI AWARDED BURSARIES TO ATTEND ALZHEIMER UNIVERSITY IN WASHINGTON

The All-Party Oireachtas Group on Dementia therefore welcomed the announcement in January 2017 that Minister of State for Mental Health and Older People, Helen McEntee TD, will be launching a consultation process with a view to establishing a new statutory home care scheme.

The All-Party Group hosted a round-table event for key stakeholders on Thursday, March 23rd to advance the discussion on how Ireland can develop a scheme for home care that is equitable, well-resourced and well-regulated.

# MOBILE INFORMATION SERVICE – UPDATE

The service was made possible thanks to funds raised by the Peggy Mangan Foundation, set up by the family of the late 67-year-old pensioner from Terenure following her tragic death in 2014.

The ASI Mobile Information Unit will bring trained personnel into the heart of Irish communities. The Mobile Information Service is an important addition

to how The ASI can provide information and support to people with dementia and their families, in their local communities.

Welcome to The Voice's Research Roundup, which aims to inform you about the many strands of research that ASI are involved with:

## Towards Resilience in Family caregiving for People with Dementia.

The ASI is a collaborator on this project, which is funded by the Health Research Board and led by UCD. The ASI is committed to providing advice and support to the project. As part of the research project, the group will work together to develop ways to Enhance Carer Resilience (EnCaRe) and develop a toolkit for family carers to enhance their resilience when caring for a loved one with dementia.

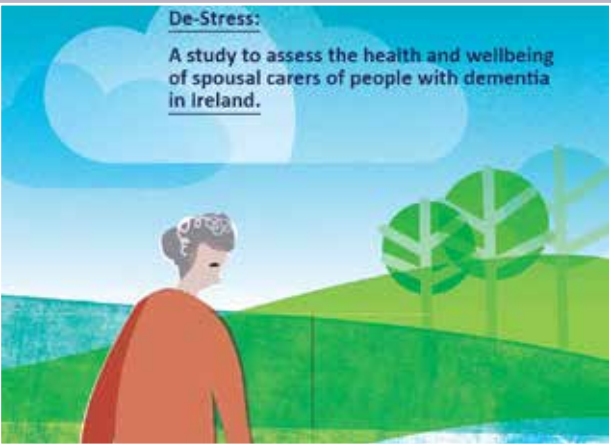
## Fitness to Drive

This project is about fitness to drive in patients with cognitive impairment and possible improvement strategies for a general practice setting. ASI provides expert advice and input into the study, which is funded by the Road Safety Authority and is led by University College Cork.

## Risk Reduction Project

The ASI has joined a co-funding collaboration with three other charities. The group is being led by the Irish Cancer Society and includes the Irish Heart Foundation and Diabetes Ireland.

The aim of the partnership is to co-fund a research project examining interventions for chronic disease risk reduction in Ireland. The three year project examines peer-to-peer motivational interview intervention for smoking, alcohol and physical activity among at-risk adolescents in lower socio-economic communities.

ASI are delighted to launch the research findings from the De-Stress Research Report, which examines the Health and Wellbeing of Spousal Carers of People with Dementia in Ireland and was led by Trinity College Dublin's NEIL programme.

# ASI TRAINING

## Home Based Care - Home Based Education Erasmus+ Project Showcase Event.

The Alzheimer Society of Ireland has successfully coordinated 'Home Based Care - Home Based Education' an Erasmus+ project since 2015.

The main aim of the project was to develop an online training course for family carers looking after a loved one with dementia. To date we have received excellent feedback from the 85 online course participants.

The one day Online Education Social Learning conference / workshop took place on Thursday, June 8th at Dublin City University.

This event helped to publicise the project and share our experiences within ASI, and to community sector organisations in Ireland and Europe who are interested in developing online training or education programmes.

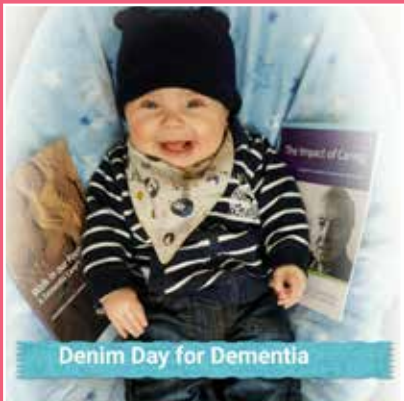

Drumming Circle – at Heskin Court

One of our Volunteers Andrew Moore conducted research into the many positive effects of drumming for peoples' health and well-being and has designed a workshop which is held every Monday at Heskin Court, Dublin 4. He starts with a short description of the drums, the history around them and examples of how they are being used. During this time everyone has time to feel the make of the drums, the skins spinning their tops, and wooden or synthetic bodies of the instruments.

Clients who might struggle with other activities, focus on the sounds, some close their eyes while they internalise the rhythm, they watch the movements of the hands and mirror these as they create the music along with everyone else in the group.

Drumming induces deep relaxation, lowers blood pressure, produces feelings of well-being, a release of emotional trauma and reduces stress and our clients love taking part. There is a great atmosphere in the room with a lot of laughter.
